





WHY? - revenue streams to TAMS have slowly dried up. The State of Tx has not kept pace with inflation and TAMS has not had an adjustment since 2018. UNT stopped helping TAMS financially since 2017.

For the first decade of TAMS, students and families would only need to pay for room and board. TODAY the costs include room, board, tuition, fees, etc. = basically all costs.

Dear TAMS Alumni.

Our alumni organization was created more than a decade ago, during a time when there were concerns about whether donations to UNT would truly support TAMS and its students. In response, alumni took the initiative to form an independent 501(c)(3) organization that could fund scholarships and projects directly at TAMS.

Since then, the landscape has shifted. Today, we believe the university is a reliable and effective steward of donations intended for TAMS. At the same time, the nonprofit infrastructure we've maintained, especially related to tax and compliance requirements, has become increasingly difficult to sustain with a completely volunteer-based board

Given all this, we are strongly considering an alternative path forward: transferring the funds and endowments we currently hold to UNT to manage, with clear direction that the original intent of these scholarships and endowments be upheld. We are confident that UNT will continue to honor donor intent and partner with alumni in making sure these funds directly benefit TAMS and its students. If we move forward, our goal would be to complete this transition by the end of the year. With Russ Stukel now focused on fundraising in his current role, having one clear channel for donations through UNT will eliminate confusion and make it easier for alumni to give confidently.

This does not mean the end of TAMS AA as we would partner with UNT to receive regular reporting on the performance of those funds and determine how those funds are best utilized for TAMS and its students. TAMS AA would also have an opportunity for the alumni network to refocus on community-building, mentorship, career connections, and other meaningful ways to support students and each other. We also believe if there is strong alumni interest in maintaining the current nonprofit mission, we welcome that and are open to transitioning leadership to those ready to carry this mission forward in a new way.
