The National Center for Educational Achievement listed Austin Middle School and Jack E. Singley Academy on the High Performing Schools list during his tenure. In 2011, Singley Academy earned the distinction of "32nd Most Connected Campus in the Country" for its use of educational technology. The school was listed as one of the Top 2000 schools in America by Newsweek in 2013. The school has been visited by various local, national, and international contingencies including the President of Texas A&M University and the U.S. Department of Education because of its success in college and career readiness. Recently, the school was honored with a National Excellence in Action Award.
